## September Proceedings

The first HTPS meeting of the year brought out a large crowd. The room was abuzz with members discussing their summer stamping adventures. The business meeting included the approval of the 2010-2011 budget and a short demonstration of our new website.

A moment of silence was held in memory of **Bob Lee**, a long time member who passed away in August. Bob was instrumental in the resurgence of our Society over the last five years.

We had a brief "Show and Tell", which included **Andrew Boyajian** showing an old folded letter with cross writing, where the author wrote the letter in one direction, and then rotated the paper 90 degrees, and continued his letter. This saved on both paper and postage costs but made the letter difficult to read.

**Ron Gonzalez** showed off a self-made cachet for the recently issued 44-cent Julia de Burgos stamp (see above). Ron attended the First Day ceremony in San Juan, Puerto Rico. He is looking for other FDC cachets for this stamp and also commercial uses, so check out those dealer boxes for Ron.

**Ron Dobrowolski** received a hearty round of applause for his first attempt at exhibiting. He created a one frame exhibit for the MERPEX show. See the article on the next page for details.

Our speaker for the meeting was **Dr. Edwin J. Andrews**, an APS accredited judge who spoke on "Exhibiting for Fun." Dr. Andrews presented some reasons why you might consider preparing an exhibit including the satisfaction of showing your material (and possibly winning a medal). He also discussed exhibiting procedures to follow as



detailed in the *APS Manual of Philatelic Judging*.

There are different types of exhibits. For example, a Traditional exhibit might document the design, production, and use of a single stamp. A postal history exhibit would describe postal routes and rates, or a macrophilily exhibit describes the various postmarks used at a particular location and time.

More unusual exhibits include Aerophilately (the development of airmail routes), Illustrated Mail (e.g., Advertising, Patriotic, or Event covers) and Maximaphily (picture postcards postmarked with a related stamp as shown here). In all cases, the exhibit must tell a story.



Dr. Andrews spoke about some of the resources available to help prepare and assemble an exhibit. He also described the criteria used to judge exhibits.

He urged anyone interested in exhibiting to spend time viewing exhibits at shows and also attending the judge's critique. This will give you a better idea of what constitutes an award winning exhibit.

Dr. Andrews' presentation will be posted on our website, along with his email address in case you wish to contact him. We thank him for an interesting and very enjoyable evening.
