## May Proceedings

Our May meeting was well attended and highlighted by HTPS elections and member mini-presentations.

**Ed Murtha** quickly moved through the business portion of the meeting. He asked for help in setting up the NOJEX stamp show in Secaucus on Memorial Day weekend.

The meeting ended with the **election of new officers** for 2012-2013 (they take office after the June meeting):

**Andrew Boyajian** showed part of his Olympic Torch cover collection. He traced the history of torch stamps / cancels from a simple 1936 cover (shown at the right) to the large variety that is produced today.

**Bob Stolarz** finished up the evening with a eclectic display of covers and other philatelic items including the bicycle advertising cover shown below.

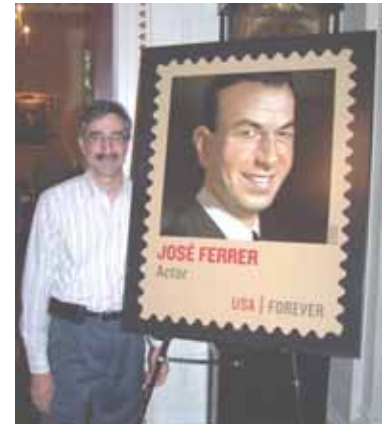


We thank all of the speakers for their presentations and ask our members to consider preparing a 10-15 minute talk for our next round of “mini” talks.

## José Ferrer FDC

On April 26, 2012, I went to New York City for the José Ferrer stamp First Day of Issue ceremony. It was held at the Players Club, founded in 1888 by Edwin Booth, brother of John Wilkes Booth. The club was formed to benefit actors and artists. First stop was the James A. Farley Post Office on 8<sup>th</sup> Ave and 34<sup>th</sup> street to purchase the Ferrer stamps early and affix them to the cards and covers I had prepared.



The postal clerks did not want to sell the stamps before 3:00 PM. After some pleading, I did get them. The next hurdle was obtaining a “hand back” postmark from the clerk. After more pleading and reciting post office regulations, I was able to obtain an unofficial first day cancellation. At the same time, I mailed several covers to obtain unofficial first day spray cancels as well.

After the post office, I went to the Collectors Club on East 35<sup>th</sup> street and worked in the library affixing the stamps to the remainder of my covers and cards.

Then it was off to the Players Club to cancel the covers. Only the “four bar” and “bulls eye” postmarks were available – there was no pictorial postmark. The post office was selling blank first day covers with the digital color and the regular

FDI postmark. First day programs were handed out to the attendees.

The ceremony included movie clips prepared by the Players Club in tribute to José Ferrer who was president of the club from 1983 to 1991. This was followed by some speeches. The attendees included José Ferrer's widow, Stella, two of his daughters, his son Rafael Ferrer, former NYC mayor David Dinkins and actors Frances Sternhagen, Christopher Lloyd and others. At the end of the ceremony, I was able to obtain autographs from the speakers and personalities.

After a hectic day, I returned home where I was able to organize my cards and covers. It was a great experience and worth the effort. Now I have another stamp to collect in First Day cover format!

## Society Auction

It is auction time again! Why not bring some of your duplicate, excess or unwanted philatelic material and put it on our auction table?



Here are some **hints** for creating lots:

- ⇒ Put up items that fellow members collect (see list below). As always, condition is key; choice or unique items usually do very well.
- ⇒ Reference publications, especially specialized or color catalogs, are always popular.
- ⇒ Postcards, postal history and ephemera also sell.

## Preparing Auction Forms

Enter your name and date (6-19-12) at the top of the **Auction List Sheet**. Enter a description of the item including Scott # (for stamps), condition, faults and catalog / retail values.

As for the Minimum Bid, be realistic – common items usually sell for 10-20% of catalog value. Use 2-3 lines, if needed, to describe the auction lot; then renumber the following items on the sheet.

For each auction item, complete an **Auction Lot form**. This form is attached to (or inserted into) the

item to be auctioned. The information should match the Auction List Sheet which will enable the Auctioneer and support staff to quickly move through the lots.

If you wish to **donate** the sales proceeds for one or more lots to HTPS, please indicate on the Auction List Sheet or tell the Auctioneer.

All items are **SOLD AS IS** so check out the offerings before bidding.

Obtain a **bidder number** before the auction starts. Bidding starts with the seller's minimum bid as shown on the Lot Description form. Increments are usually 25¢ but the Auctioneer may change increments based on competitive bidding.

**Payments** are made by the winning bidders after all auction items are sold. The sellers are paid the sales price realized MINUS a 10% commission for HTPS. Amounts are rounded to 5¢ increments.

## Fingerprints & Stamps (source: [linns.com](http://linns.com))

One of the first warnings received by new stamp collectors is "Don't get fingerprints on your stamps." However, some stamps come with fingerprints already on them as part of their design.

A recent example is a 2006 stamp from the Netherlands (Scott #1248). The €0.39 stamp highlights Zwolle whose residents are called Bluefingers. The nickname dates back to 1682 when Zwolle sold church bells to the city of Kampen and were paid in copper pennies. As the citizens of Zwolle counted each coin, the copper turned their fingers blue.



This is just one example of fingerprints on stamps. If you thumb through your collection, perhaps you will find more. This could be a good idea for an exhibit or a "mini" presentation at a HTPS meeting.

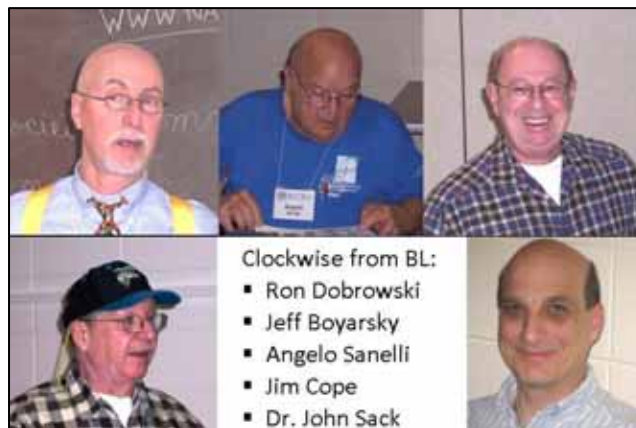


We used some of the HAMPEX entries for our philatelic exhibit at the **Hamilton library** during the month of September.

Long-time HTPS member Frank A. Wheeler Jr., 91, passed away, peacefully, on Friday, May 11, 2012. Born in Pittsfield, MA, Frank lived in Schenectady, NY, until he entered the Army in 1940. Frank was married to his childhood sweetheart, the late Olive Shufelt Wheeler, for 56 years.

He was a WW II veteran serving in the China and Burma Theatres. After the war, he served two tours of duty in Germany and later was stationed at Fort Dix making his home in Mercer County, NJ.

In 1960, after retiring from the Army, Frank worked at Fort Dix as a property book officer. He retired in 1978 and worked for the Bank of Mid Jersey.

Frank was an avid stamp collector. He was a member of the First Presbyterian Church of Hamilton Square for 57 years serving as a deacon, elder and treasurer. He also was a life member of VFW Post 3525 and belonged to the Nottingham Squares Seniors Club.

On behalf of the HTPS membership, we extend our condolences to the Wheeler family.
