


September's presentation on "U.S. Telegraph Stamps" is provided by **Roger Brody**. Roger has spoken to our group before and always provides an entertaining and informative talk. Last year he spoke to our group on the definitive series of 1902.

Roger is chairman of the United States Stamp Society, past president of The Collectors Club (in NYC) and president of the American Philatelic Research Library.

The **October 15<sup>th</sup>** meeting is highlighted by a presentation on the first International Aeronautics Show held in Frankfurt in 1909 --- usually referred to as the ILA show (from the German Internationale Luft- und Raumfahrttausstellung).

**Hank Applegate** will give the presentation which will include some unique and striking philatelic material on early airmail issues and covers.




Of note is the wide array of Zeppelin items and information. This is not surprising since Hank is very familiar with the Zeppelin world.

## July–August Proceedings . . . by Jack Sack

The **July meeting** was an informal gathering with no society business being conducted.

**Ed Muench** showed his wheel of bicycle stamps that he used for a presentation at the 2013 Wheelmen National Meet in June. Ed collects all types of bicycle memorabilia including stamps, covers and books.



**Bill Andersen** suggested that members consider a gift of stamps as a holiday or special occasion gift. He is pictured with a framed collection of ‘Laboratory Technology’ stamps that he gave to his brother.

Our **August meeting**, aka **HAMPEX’13**, included our annual member exhibit and bourse. The judges awarded prizes to four of the displays:



- **Bob Stolarz** --- Rhodesia 1890's set showing the British South Africa Company coat of arms.
- **Andrew Boyajian** --- Nolan Ryan covers with Alvin, TX pictorial cancel and hologram cachet.
- **Jack Sack** --- Stamps featuring Tomas Masaryk, first President of Czechoslovakia.
- **Jim Cope** --- CEPT / Europa stamp collection.

Each of the exhibits provided a little piece of postal history. For example, CEPT is the organization that

regulates telecommunications and postal standards in Europe. Many of the 48 member nations issue stamps to honor CEPT annually.

In the bourse area, stamp collectors were looking for bargains among the philatelic material for sale or trade.

There was also a speaker at **HAMPEX’13**. **Milt Keiles** showed some ‘corner card’ covers with airmail etiquettes. Shown below is a nice example sent from Australia to Canada.

Four HTPS members (see image below) joined MSC members on August 29 to help set up the dealer tables and exhibit frames for the annual MERPEX show.




MERPEX ran two days this year – August 30-31. The show featured a variety of dealers ranging from Harry Tong’s five table spread to single table “boutique” offerings. The U.S. Postal Service’s table offered current commemorative issues for sale. Early reports indicate a very good attendance during the show especially on Friday.

The 60 frame exhibit included some unusual entries including three from HTPS club members **Hank Applegate** and **Ron Dobrowolski**.

Of note were three entries from young philatelists shown in the column to the right. All earned judges awards and multiple organization citations





One of our dealer friends, **Ryan Terlecky** – pictured above next to his bourse tables – has taken over as manager for the Hightstown Stamp Bourse held on the second Saturday of each month.

Ryan is a teacher in the Philadelphia school system. On weekends and vacation periods, he can be seen at the Hightstown show as well as the Merchantville bourse and the Columbus flea market.

As a dealer, Ryan is best known for his HUGE stock of stamp albums, pages and other material where stamps prices are either 10¢ or 25¢ regardless of the stamp’s value. He also has better material for sale at reasonable prices and is always willing to negotiate.

### Stamp Identification

Congratulations to **Ron Kane** for correctly identifying last issue’s stamp as Siberia #9 issued in Omsk in 1919 and used for mail on the Trans-Siberian railway route to Vladivostok.



Some responders guessed #3 thinking it was the perforated issue of the series.

This month’s stamp has perfs as clearly shown.

25 free stamps from our 10¢ boxes or albums for the first correct responder.

### US Flag Stamps – 2012 Issue



In 2012, the USPS issued a set of four flag stamps. The flag designs were identical, except for a single word positioned beneath the flag: Freedom, Liberty, Equality or Justice.

As often happens with issues destined for wide usage, the stamps were printed by multiple manufacturers and created in different formats. U.S. postage stamp collectors will need to identify the types and varieties included in this issue. A brief overview is provided below.

- Avery Dennison Coil (Scott #4629–4632) – die cut perf 8.5.
- Ashton-Potter Coil (Scott #4633–4636) – die cut perf 9.5.
- Sennett Security Products Coil (Scott #4637–4640) – die cut perf 11.
- Ashton-Potter Booklet of 20 (Scott #4641–4644) – 18.5mm from LL to LR corners of flag.
- Sennett Security Booklet of 20 (Scott #4645–4648) – 19.0mm from LL to LR corners of flag.
- Avery Dennison Booklet of 10 (Scott #4673–4676) – 18.25mm from LL to LR corners with larger/ less bold microprinting than other booklets.
- Ashton-Potter ATM Booklet of 18 (Scott #4706-4709) – thinner paper than the other booklets.
