MAY MEETING PROCEEDINGS

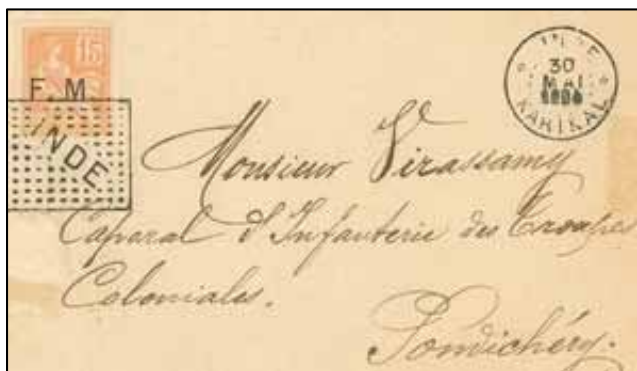


You have all probably seen these stamps – common French definitives overprinted with the initials **F.M.** – but do you know what they were used for? We had the pleasure of hosting our old friend and noted philatelist, **Ed Grabowski**, at our May meeting to explain it to us.

The initials **F.M.** stand for “**Franchise Militaire**” and were overprinted on stamps in the early 1900’s for French servicemen to mail free letters. Prior to that time, free-frank letters required a special endorsement and the signature of the soldier’s commander. Introduced in 1901, the FM stamps were designed to simplify the process. However, because of the difficulty of getting the stamps to troops in combat, they were primarily used by troops on station in French colonies while soldiers in war zones continued to use the old endorsement process.



While the mint stamps with the F.M. overprint are quite common, it has taken Ed over 30 years to find just 30 of the F.M. stamps used on cover. Below is a 1906 cover from Karikal in French India, cancelled with a square INDE postmark that uses a F.M. stamp for free postage.



The F.M. stamps are really just ‘labels’ denoting free-franking so the denomination of the stamp did not always correspond to the current postal rate. Also, the stamps were only valid for paying the first weight level, but Ed found covers where two F.M. stamps were used together to incorrectly pay for heavier letters (example at the right).



We thank Ed for taking the time sharing his philatelic knowledge with us. Check out our website for Ed’s presentation which includes all the F.M. covers in his “Franchise Militaire’ collection.

No talk by Ed would be complete without an update on our old swindler friend, **A. Victor Segno** (pictured) and his various business enterprises. Among his recent finds was a rare 1918 registered cover mailed from Tete, Zambesia to the American Institute of Mentalism in Los Angeles, CA.



The cover (shown below) is franked with two 50 reis Zambesia stamps, a 2½ centavos Lourenco Marques stamp and a Mozambique 1 centavo war tax stamp on the back. That is quite a mix of stamp issues. The equivalent of \$10 was enclosed to have Prof. Segno send some success waves towards the sender.



Ed recently obtained a Segno souvenir Success Spoon – a follow-up product to the Success Key (in



fact, an image of the Success Key is engraved into the handle). The bowl of the spoon has a view of their new office building and is inscribed “THE SEGNO

GRAM PUBLISHING HOUSE.” Like other Segno products, the spoon is designed to inspire success in both the giver and the recipient.

As always, Ed is always looking for more Segno letters and paraphernalia and he would be grateful if you would send any finds his way.

MERPEX 2016

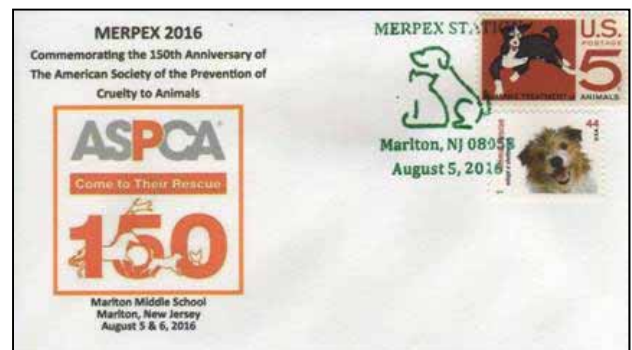
After a hiatus in 2015, the MERPEX exhibition and bourse is back. Sponsored by the Merchantville Stamp Club (MSC), this mid-summer event is back at a new location and show date.



MERPEX 2016 will be held August 5-6 at the Marlon Middle School, 150 Tomlinson Mill Road, Marlon, NJ. Show hours are Friday from 10 AM to 5 PM, and Saturday 9 AM to 4 PM. Admission and parking are free. [Note: The show building is NOT the same as the MSC monthly bourse building, but is adjacent to it.]

The show features:

- ⇒ 60 frames of stamp exhibits.
- ⇒ 20 dealers offering stamps, covers and other collectibles.
- ⇒ USPS table with current postal items.
- ⇒ Show cachet and cancel honoring the 150th anniversary of the ASPCA.

We hope many of you had a chance to attend World Stamp Show NY2016 last month at the Javits Center in New York City. An international stamp show of this magnitude is held only once a decade in the US and it was only a train ride away from Hamilton!



Everyone has their own favorite memory of the show – from seeing some of the world’s rarest stamps including the British Guiana 1 cent magenta (shown at the left), or visiting the USPS booth or the 50

foreign postal administrations, or picking up that elusive stamp from one of the 150 vendors, or viewing the over 4,000 exhibit frames.

The show also included hundreds of presentations, including one by our own Ron Gonzalez (pictured at the right). His talk was on Puerto Rican stationary Note that Ron is wearing a HTPS t-shirt.



There was a new stamp issue almost every day providing an opportunity not only to attend a First Day of Issue ceremony but also to purchase and postmark the stamp on the actual date of issue. If you were fortunate enough, you might have had a chance to get into the auction room to see the inverted Jenny being sold for over \$1.4 million (Sadly, I was not able to attend).



The thing I will remember most is the excitement at the show and the opportunity to meet fellow collectors from around the world. It was clear that the hobby of stamp collecting is still going strong! I hope you will all be around to visit the next international show in the U.S. – Boston 2026.

VOLUNTEERING AT NY2016

Due to my good looks and great personality, I was asked to be a “Roaming Greeter / On-Call” volunteer. There I am pictured below in a volunteer shirt with HTPS members **Ron González** (leftmost) and **Andrew Boyajian**.
